More information to share: As of May 31, the State is anticipated to no longer have discretionary exemptions to continue the waiver for able-bodied adults without dependents. June 1 would start counting the 3-month clock for able-bodied adults without dependents if they are not working at least 80 hours a month or meeting another

exemption. Walk-ins are down 3%, about 43 a day.

DAUPHIN COUNTY ASSISTANCE OFFICE

CAO Representative: Liz Pliszka

Cash Applications: Cash applications are down considerably. Staff currently have 261 applications pending on dashboards. We continue to struggle to move beyond 10% for full participation rates on the WPR report, which is going away soon anyway. Staff are using the new report/database the Department provided to monitor; that report provides more useful data.

Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Participating in E&T Numbers:



Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Numbers: Staff currently have 1531 applications pending on the dashboard – about 60 apps less than the last LMC report. Staff continue to make SNAP and LIHEAP processing a priority.

Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) Numbers: The LIHEAP cash and crisis season was extended to 4/18/25. The weatherization portion ended 4/4/25. As of 4/4/25, we received 9747 applications, approximately 92 % of the applications we normally receive in a season. York LIHEAP processing center and other processing centers handle many of our LIHEAP-only applications. Dauphin CAO staff currently have 471 applications pending on their dashboards, some with other budgets attached or involving crisis.

Staffing Updates: Staff have been working voluntary overtime 1 day per month. Unsure if it will continue beyond April. We continue interviewing and hiring for IMCW (Caseworkers) and Clerical in both offices - working towards full complement, but it isn't easy to stay there with turnover. Hiring 3 new Income Maintenance Casework Supervisors to fill vacancies – hope to have them start before the end of this month. We have 13 Caseworker trainees in 3 stages of training, and 5 Clerical Assistant 2's under 6 months in the Hbg. Office. Hiring 3-5 more caseworkers, some to backfill for the Supervisor hiring, and 2-3 clerical for the Hbg. Office. Johnstown office just hired 2 new clerical assistants (started 4/6) and 2 new caseworkers (start dates to be determined) who will be going to training in the next month.

Additional Information: Walk-in traffic was down for the past month but increased again this week. EBT Skimming reports continue. We continue to educate the public on card safety and online/APP safety, changing their PIN# frequently. Locking and unlocking of cards are coming soon as a feature. PA CAP/FS 70 cases are being transitioned to regular SNAP cases – these were SNAP cases opened through automatic processing through the Social Security Administration for some SSI recipients. Older PA CAP cases are closing for 4/30/25 and require the individual to file an application (PA 1935) for SNAP to be reviewed and reopened. Notices and applications were sent to all PA CAP recipients. We are starting to receive some applications back already.

are also hiring 2 new clerical staff.

(From February denominator report) Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Numbers: SNAP applications have remained consistent over the past month or two. The most recent 30-day period resulted in 83 applications.

LIHEAP: At this point in the program, application receipt volume has been consistent with that of past years. Juniata has received 975 applications through 03/21/25, with .62% remaining pending.

Staffing Updates: Juniata is fully staffed.

Update: TANF Dress for Success is only receiving referrals from Dauphin County. The CAO must refer TANF participants, and cash assistance is a requirement. The program offers a \$150.00 special allowance for interview training and employment suiting.

EDUCATION YIELDS SUCCESS (KEYS)

Update: Student intakes and facilitator and coordinator caseloads have significantly increased over the last two months. There are two open positions, one in York and the other in Lancaster. The Keys Facilitator positions are currently accepting applications. The requirements are an associate's degree with four years of experience or a bachelor's degree with some case management background. Twenty students are about to graduate in spring.



EDUCATION LEADING TO EMPLOYMENT AND CAREER TRAINING (ELECT)

Update: CAIU (Capital Intermediate Unit) will hold an end-of-year event for ELECT students on Thursday, June 12th. The first hour is CAIU's annual ELECT Market Place, where community vendors set up to share their resources/services with ELECT students. Students receive a passport to get signed off by each vendor. The flyer is attached. Please share!

ELECT is hosting an in-person Spring Event at the CAIU on April 30th. The AmeriHealth Caritas mobile unit will share resources with students. Penn State-Hershey Medical Center residents will present on health-related topics, such as SIDS prevention. We have a Mother's Day craft planned, as well as a spring egg hunt.

Staffing Updates: Darian Rahnis has been acting as EARN Deputy Director since Tonya Seibert's departure. EARN has hired Bayleana Sowers as the Special Projects Manager. Initiatives: EARN is currently participating in a joint effort with the Department of Corrections. 8 participants who were previously incarcerated are enrolled in the program and receiving culinary training through the DOC. EARN is providing them case management and paying them a wage while they complete their training.

Virtual Reality (VR): EARN participants participate in a new VR workshop (Developing Industry Skills through Career and Occupational Virtual Reality-DISCOVR). This three-day workshop focuses on employment readiness, career exploration, and resume development.

English as Second Language (ESL): York County CareerLink® is partnering with HACC

WORK-READY (PATH STONE)

Update: Participants' main concerns are childcare, housing, and transportation. A success story was shared of a participant who completed their professional caregiver credential and secured employment in home healthcare. Within 6 months, they were prompted and working full time.

Update: Program in Person Monthly File Review was completed in March 2025. 10 Files were reviewed from Dauphin, Lebanon, and Cumberland counties. SCPa Works Program staff met with the EARN Supervisors to discuss issues/concerns that were identified. There will be no review in April, but it will resume on Thursday, May 15th. In my review, the files that will be reviewed will be from York, Adams, Franklin, Perry, and Juniata counties.



SCPa WORKS - BUSINESS SERVICES

Update: Business Services are being restructured. SCPa Works is working with Knovva to determine best practices, and a plan to relaunch will occur in spring. Business Services is also working on more specific types of job fairs that benefit EARN participants.

SCPa WORKS - COMPLIANCE MONITORING

File Audit: March 2025

Counties Monitored: Adams - 1, Cumberland - 3, Dauphin - 10, Franklin - 2, Juniata -

0, Lebanon - 3, Perry - 1, and York - 7. Total of 27 files.

Findings: All 27 files have an AMR or EDP present in the file. 16 of the 27 files have IEPs that need signatures from the participant and/or the staff. All 27 files had section 1 of the family assessment in the file. 20 out of the 27 files are/were open in code 33/93. 9 out of the 20 files opened in employment did not have a 01 opened as of the file review. 2 of the 20 files had an error or issue with the EVF. 6 out of 20 files had data entry errors with their employment hours. Case note frequency and the ability to tell the participant's story are still inconsistent. There are infrequencies with outreach and providing details of what is going on with the case. Of the 27 files, there are 8 that are missing the participants' resumes. There is little to no BSR interaction case noted.

Additional Information: The next monitoring is scheduled for July 2025.
